Attendance & Punctuality



It is essential that your child attends school each day if he / she is to reach their full potential. Our school is in the fortunate position of having a School Completion Project (SCP) in operation. Each morning a member of the SCP team checks attendance in each class and rings the

homes of all children, who are absent on that day. This is standard practice. If for some reason your child is sick, <u>please send in a written</u> note to explain the absence on his / her return to school. If your child misses 20 days of school, the school is obliged to report him / her to the Education Welfare Service. Please ensure your child comes to school on time every day.

Your child needs to be in school for the full day i.e. until 1:40pm (Junior / Senior Infants) and until 2:40pm (1st -6th classes). Please do not collect your child early except in exceptional circumstances. Thanks for your cooperation with this matter.
